The MES staff works tirelessly and with enthusiasm to provide a joyful learning environment while focusing upon implementing curriculum and enhancing student progress.

In educating the whole child, our goal is for each child to develop academically as well as socially-emotionally to their fullest potential.

We are fortunate to have staffing resources for student mental health support as well as employing a Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) to assist children in the least restrictive environment.

We have enhanced early intervention by expanded our Pre-K Program for 4-year-olds from four to five days per week.

We are aligning curriculum, instruction, and assessment within and across grade levels to promote student academic success, love of learning, and healthy sense of self.

Our Prek-3 Literacy Program incorporates the Science of Reading and is designed to build student competency in oral language, phonemic awareness, phonics, letter name fluency and word recognition automaticity, vocabulary, reading fluency and comprehension.

Our students ranked 15th out of 182 schools in the state on the 2022 Next Generation Science Standards assessment.

We continue to enhance students' school experience by offering an enriching program in Art, Music, Spanish, Physical Education, Health, Research, and Coding.

We maintain a commitment to the community value of developmentally appropriate class sizes.
