2023-2024 Budget Highlights

The BOE Budget maintains a commitment to class sizes, programs, and services that are integral to the success of Marlborough Elementary School students.

It contains the necessary investments in staffing, curriculum, instruction, professional development, and operations as outlined in the MES Strategic Continuous Improvement Plan (SCIP) to run an outstanding, safe, and happy school to meet learners where they are and lead them to gains in the acquisition of fundamental knowledge and skills.

The Operating Budget and Capital Improvement Plan amount to a 0.57% increase over FY23 funding.

- The Operating Budget includes the addition of two necessary positions; a School Resource Officer (SRO) & a Director of Operations (Facilities/Technology/ Security Systems/Transportation)
- A significantly smaller Capital Plan request compared to FY23 funding buffers the Operating Budget increase of 4.82% (2% of which is due to the added positions).
- The Capital Improvement Plan funding request includes (1) An Architectural Study, necessary to be eligible for federal and state reimbursement for projects. The study would lead to the development of a long-term Capital Plan; (2) Continued maintenance of the school building's brick exterior, and; (3) Replacement of five exterior doors.
